Scholarships for Post-Secondary Education in El Savador

In El Salvador relatively few young people have the opportunity to continue their studies beyond secondary school. In spring 2016 Sombrilla started a new project in collaboration with CEBES PERQUIN, a local NGO in El Salvador. The project provides scholarships for young adults from rural communities to complete their postsecondary education. The partner organization in El Salvador currently sup-

ports 10 students obtaining degrees ranging from Business Administration and Accounting to Registered Nurse and Laboratory Technician. The scholarship allows students to fulfill their professional and personal goals.



An addition to receiving scholarships, students are requested to stay involved with their communities after the completion for their degrees. Students will share their time and skills with the community members of their hometowns. While in past years, community involvement was left to the discretion of each student who received a scholarship, CEBES Perquin has now defined involvement in the local community as working with young people. Each student is asked to form a youth group, with 5 or 6 members. The groups meet twice a month to reflect on the issues affecting young people today. Page 2

The youths who are benefiting from scholarships are from north of Morazan - Torola, San Fernando and Perquin.

The scholarship covers the following: food, transportation and studies. Total monthly cost of \$125. The other \$45 dollars will be come from the student, his/her family and the CEB's in El Salvador. The recipients will pay back 10% of their scholarship with a limit of 3 years after graduation. The money will be used to support additional students. After graduation, community banks provide loans to students who received a scholarship. This will make is easier for students to pay the 10% back over the period of three years.

Some of the youths have received scholarship since high school until comple-

tion of their careers. The graduated are now lawyers, Sociologist, Psychologist, Social Workers, Computer Analysts, Tree Planting, etc. All of them have assumed social commitment in their communities.
